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Saturday, November 22, 2014 Delta Downs Race 7 \$1M G3 Delta Downs Jackpot

The Pace: Quality speed horses are tough to tackle with only 660 feet of stretch to work with in the lane. While deep closers have had some success in this race, you want to be in the mix – and if the speed is of some quality – you have to respect it.

Race Notes: The Jackpot offers Kentucky Derby qualifying points on the 10-4-2-1 scale as implemented by Churchill Downs ... Rain is in the forecast, so keep flexible with options for an off track and consult the updated conditions ... A \$200,000-guaranteed pick four pool will be offered on Races 4-7 and the past 2 years the pool has exceeded \$254k.

- 1 **Prime Engine**: Was 3/1 morning line favorite in a hundred-grander at Del Mar on Saturday and Hall of Fame trainer Jerry Hollendorfer instead opted to put him on a plane and shoot for the million bucks here. That's an awfully good sign for the pride of Seattle, who dominated two casts at Emerald Downs and now gets the class test. But remember: 'Class' means very little in 2-year-old racing as we don't know the relative ceilings of the juveniles at this stage. Good speed from the rail and figures to get pressed to the outside by Mr. Z, Conquest Tsunami and Ocho Ocho Ocho. That's significant heat to overcome.
- 2 **Dekabrist**: Barn has been known to pop a huge stakes surprise on occasion, but 4 straight losses by double-digit lengths has me on the "prefer others" bandwagon.
- 3 Mr. Z: BC Juvenile fifth when adding blinkers, he's faced some heavyweights in the 2YO ranks to date. Much to like, but curious to see Mike Smith jump off of him to ride Ocho Ocho Ocho. Front-end ace Paco Lopez picks up the call in a good

style fit, however. Not sure he's battling to pass horses in a race where he's not likely fast enough to get the front end. Tough read, but could certainly see him in the exotics

- 4 Conquest Tsunami: Trainer Mark Casse won this race with Turf War in '07 (dead-heat), but also disappointed mightily last year with 8/5 chalk Coastline. Really disliked what I saw visually late in his Kee route bid & until he proves himself around 2 turns, I'd demand a much bigger price than he's likely to offer Saturday.
- 5 Saratoga Heater: All 3 career starts have been on wet tracks, so trainer Al Stall likely will be doing a rain dance and the forecasters say he might get it. On a fast track, he's a complete unknown as I never trust wet-track form at face value. NY-bred seems to match up decently with most of these on an off-track. Contends if wet, but stand against otherwise.
- 6 Golden Actor: Much appreciation here for the historical success Florida horses have shown at Delta in the stakes ranks. Just cruised in the local prep and has worked strongly at Delta since the layover. Fair to wonder if jockey Jose Gallego blinks with a million bucks on the line as he's new to the US scene from South America, but this stable's racing advisor is Hall of Fame jock Jose Santos, so there's internal respect for Gallego. If he works out a trip similar to the Jean Lafitte, Golden Actor will be the horse to beat Saturday.
- 7 **Red Button**: If the track turns up wet, here's your hot ticket as a grandson of the fabulously predictive mud sire Skip Trial. He's run well on dirt, turf and Poly to date and his second in the Zuma Beach looked even better after the winner returned to run a bang-up second to Hootenanny in the BC Juvenile Turf. Usable on fast dirt, but even more provocative in the mud/slop.

- 8 Wake Up Nick: Team O'Neill has been hit or miss in the Jackpot with Goldencents winning 2 years ago & Rum Point running last in 2013. This colt, 5-for-6, appears somewhere in the middle of those stablemates in terms of talent. Not quite sure he's capable of improving in a route based on pedigree, but his even-handed style sprinting should translate pretty well. No real knocks, just prefer a few others more.
- 9 Far Right: His late pace figures from BRIS sprinting indicate he could appreciate the extra ground Saturday. This is a January foal with some extra time to develop and that never hurts for a 2YO. The only real issue is that his even style and wide draw often conspire for ground loss as you'd rather be pure speed or a pure closer from post 9 on a bullring. Corey Lanerie has tough choices to make, but a capable rider and capable horse.
- 10 Ocho Ocho Ocho: Rise Up won this race a year ago from post 10, so it can be done with a long run to the clubhouse turn. But unlike Rise Up, here's a speed horse without 2-turn experience and it will be a tough prediction how he'll handle that first bend given his inexperience and fast-starting style. Extremely quick out west and in Hall of Fame hands. Major threat if he handles the first turn.
- 11 (AE) **Unblunted**: Bred more to be a closing sprinter than a router; only came home in :13 in SA maiden win. Pass if in.
- 12 (AE) **Two Six Wins**: Inconsistency over multiple surfaces a concern as would be first route and wide trip. Not for me if in.
