- 8. In the event of a tie, all winning hands will divide the prize monies equally.
- 9. Suits hold no significance for Royal and Straight Flushes. Kickers hold no significance when a four of a kind is made.
- 10. If the minimum qualifying hand is not met, the prize monies will be carried over and added to the next shift's high hand prize. This will continue until a winning qualifying hand occurs.
- 11. A player making a potential qualifying hand must notify the dealer and floor immediately upon completion of that hand. Failure to do so may disqualify the hand.

- 13. Each shift's high hand will be posted at the end of each qualifying period. (8:00 a.m., 4:00 p.m., and 12 midnight)

- 15. Proper identification is required for all payouts. Social Security card/number is required for all taxable payouts of \$600 or more.
