

# POKER ROOM

## Daily Poker Tournament Rules

1. All participants must be 21 years of age or older.
2. Daily tournaments begin at 12:05pm and 7:05pm daily. Daily tournaments may be cancelled during special events and/or holidays. Starting times may also be subject to change.
3. Tournament buy-ins are \$75, \$100 and \$125.
4. \$20 will be withheld from the \$75 & \$100 tournaments, and \$25 from the \$125 tournaments, for administration fees, staff gratuities and tournament player of the month funding.
5. Players will start with 7,500 in chips for the \$75 tournaments, 10,000 in chips for the \$100 tournaments and 12,500 in chips for the \$125 tournament.
6. Tournament structures are posted in the poker room and on the tournament schedule.
7. Player agreements regarding prize pool payouts are permissible, as long as the agreement is unanimously decided upon by all remaining participants.
8. Re-entries are allowed through the first break only. A player must lose all of his/her chips in order to re-enter a tournament. If seats are available, re-entries will be assigned a seat promptly. If an alternate list exists, re-entries will be placed at the bottom of the alternate list.
9. Players are eliminated from the tournament once all of their chips have been relinquished, and the re-entry period has needed.
10. As players are eliminated from the tournament, the tournament floor will keep the tables balanced utilizing Orleans general tournament procedures.
11. A form W2-G will be issued to those that net more than \$5,000. The buy-in amount is deducted from the winnings. Non-resident aliens are subject to a 30% withholding, and will be issued a form 1042-S
12. All winners must produce a valid I.D. and social security card/number for net winnings of more than \$5,000, minus the buy-in.
13. Management reserves the right to limit the number of entrants based on table availability.
14. Management reserves the right to cancel, or make revisions to daily tournaments at its sole discretion, and without prior notice.
15. Penalties may be imposed to anyone found not in compliance with Orleans general rules, tournament rules, and/or inappropriate behavior. If the issuance of penalties do not provide corrective action, an individual may be subject to disqualification, at the discretion of the tournament floorperson. A disqualified patron will forfeit all monies he/she has contributed, as well as rights to any portion of the prize pool.
16. Any dispute or situation not covered by these rules shall be resolved by the property's management in a manner that is fair to all parties. If the patron is not satisfied with management's decision, he/she may exercise their rights under NRS 463.362 et eq., and request the Nevada Gaming Control Board to review the matter.
