Fall Classic Contest Scoring and Rules

1. Contestants will make 12 individual \$100 win only contest wagers per entry each day (mythical wagers). All wagers must be \$100win. Contest wagers may be made on more than one selection per race, but it may not be the same horse. Each \$100 win bet is a separate wager and will count as one of the twelve wagers for the day. Entries and fields go as a single wagering interest. No quarter horse race wager will be accepted.
2. Twelve races must be played at the players choosing from the list of eligible contest tracks and races that will be offered at the Orleans during the tournament. In the event of a system failure / computer malfunction and or dispute: Contestants must keep track of the number of plays made each day (12 plays each day). Any contestant making more than the required number of plays per day may be disqualified. It is the contestant's responsibility to keep all tournament tickets until the completion of the tournament. Tournament officials may request to see your tournament tickets / selections at any time.
3. Contest officials will provide a list of eligible simulcast tracks and races at least one week prior to the contest. All tracks and times are subject to change each Tournament Day.
4. Scratches will be refunded (0 points) and must be re-bet. Any unused wagers at the end of the day will be 0 points and will not be credited, refunded or carried over. If a player has wagered on a race that is considered a non-race, that selection will be considered no action and returned to the player.
5. Contest points will be based on full track odds for the first \$20. All amounts over \$20 will be graded with a prize cap of 19-1.
Losing or unused contest wagers are worth 0 points.
7. It is the contestant's responsibility to make sure that their contest ticket is accurate. Self-betting machines cannot void tickets if a ticket needs to be voided, you must go to the specified contest void window. No ticket will be changed or altered after the race is locked out. No points will be credited on a contest wager that has not been accepted into the computer system regardless of the circumstances.
8. It is the contestant's responsibility to make sure they press the finish button when they have completed making their selection(s) to clear the machine and exit from their account. If contestant(s) fails to do this another contestant will be able to place selections on your account. Boyd Gaming will not be responsible if this should happen. All completed plays will stand.
9. All disputes must be registered by 9:00am the following day. Contest will be official at 9:15am each day unless there is a dispute.
10. In the event of a tie for any position, the prize money will be divided equally among the tied contestants. For example: If there is a two way tie for third place, the tied contestants will split third and fourth prize money and so on. If in the event of a tie for any of the twenty entries awarded into the 2015 Horse Player World Series, The first tie breaker will be the player(s) with the most wins.
The second tie breaker will be the player(s) who signed up first. There will only be twenty Entries given away to the Horse Player World Series.
11. Winners of Tournament entries are non-transferable.
12. Partners, Corporations, LTD's, INC's and LLC's are not allowed. Contestants are signed up and entered into the contest/tournament as an individual person and must provide proper identification and social security number / TIN number for required payouts.
13. There will be no refunds once the tournament has started.
14. Contestants must be at least 21 years of age.
15. All Boyd Gaming house rules apply to the contest unless otherwise stated.
16. All contestants grant permission to Boyd Gaming to use their name and photograph for publicity purposes.
17. Management reserves all rights, including the right to modify or cancel this contest, at its sole discretion, and at any time. In the event of a cancellation, all entry fees and deposits will be refunded.
18. Any dispute or situation not covered by these rules shall be resolved by the properties management, in a manner that is fair to all parties. If the patron is not satisfied with management's decision, he or she may exercise their rights under NRS 463.361 ET eq. and request the Nevada Gaming Control Board to review the matter.
